Sharing Hope and Peace through the Word of Christ!

September 13, 2020

The child swung and missed for the ninth time. The parents in the stands kept cheering the girl on. Maybe she will hit the ball this time. Another windup, another pitch, another miss. Ten times, seven more than she is allowed. "Come on sweetie, you can do it!" echoed from the stands. Finally bat and ball connected. A slower roller to second and she was safe. One batter later and she was now out in the field. The first batter of the other team came up, a young girl with down syndrome. She stepped into the batter's box and took a hard cut at the first pitch. Strike one. Then a slow curve came second and she stood mesmerized. Strike two. Then a fastball whizzed down the hard of the plate and she swung the bat after the ball hit the glove. Strike three. She's out. But she stood in the batter's box waiting for the next pitch and it came. Yet the girl who received 10 pitches in the field was livid. Three strikes! She's out! Why does she get more?!?! It didn't take long for her manager to pull her off the field and sit her down on the bench.

The astronomical sum that the debtor owed his master is beyond reasoning. It would have taken at least 1,000 years for him to pay it off. I'm not sure who is more out of their mind in this parable. The debtor who thinks he can work this off or the king who forgives the debt? But this is God's grace. This is life in the kingdom. God's forgiveness and grace is greater than we expect. The fact that His Son died for our sin, and not only ours, but the whole world should show us how merciful He is. And so that mercy enlivens us to show mercy. No, it's not easy to forgive. But it is not a question of ease. For you are Christ's and as Christ's you are commanded to forgive.

Confession

What is Confession?

Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.

What sins should we confess?

Before God we should plead guilty of all sins, even those we are not aware of, as we do in the Lord's Prayer; but before the pastor we should confess only those sins which we know and feel in our hearts.

¹As for the one who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not to quarrel over opinions. ²One person believes he may eat anything, while the weak person eats only vegetables. ³Let not the one who eats despise the one who abstains, and let not the one who abstains pass judgment on the one who eats, for God has welcomed him. ⁴Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. ³³ And should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?' ³⁴ And in anger his master delivered him to the jailers, until he should pay all his debt. ³⁵ So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart."
